PARKS AND RECREATION

The Parks & Recreation Department develops state-of-the-art facilities and operates recreation programs for the Township for kids, adults and seniors—an array of activities that are outlined in the "Recreation" program catalog mailed to all Township residents three times each year.

The Parks & Recreation Board and Staff plan, organize and conduct all Township-sponsored recreational programs, activities and special events; they organize volunteers, develop special programs, and build citizen participation in Township recreational programs.

Miles Park features five baseball fields, two softball fields, a soccer field, picnic pavilion, an expanded playground, a tot lot and a walking/jogging path. Cedar Grove Park offers the Whitemarsh Community Art Center and a baseball/softball field, T-ball fields, basketball courts and a playground with pre-school appropriate structure. CODE ENFORCEMENT & BUILDING PERMITS

The Code Enforcement and Building Department is responsible for issuing all building permits and the enforcement of the Township's property maintenance codes.

Examples of projects requiring building permits:

- ALL BUILDINGS ADDITIONS AND RENOVATIONS, BOTH INTERIOR AND EXTERIOR
- DECKS, GARAGES AND IN-GROUND OR ABOVEGROUND SWIMMING POOLS
- SHEEDS LARGER THAN 120 SQUARE FEET
- ROOFING, SIDING AND REPLACEMENT OF WINDOWS
- INSTALLATION OR REPLACEMENT OF HEATING OR AIR CONDITIONING EQUIPMENT
- REPLACEMENT OF SIDEWALKS, CURBS AND DRIVEWAY APRONS
- ALL CHANGES TO PLUMBING, DRAIN AND WATER LINES

Many projects also require zoning approval, and review by the Township Engineer, and/or the Shade Tree Commission. Anyone contemplating making property or building improvements should contact the Township for guidance.

THE FINANCE DEPARTMENT

The Finance Department is responsible for the administration of all activities pertaining to the receipt, expenditure, accounting, investment, custody and control of municipal funds and assets. The Finance Department also collects and receives all taxes, sewer rents, and other monies due or receivable by the Township. The Department does authorize other municipal, or service, units to perform certain collection functions under prescribed procedures. The Department assists in the operation, maintenance and reporting of financial plans and budgets. It assists the Township Manager oversee the purchase of goods and services, and advises the Township Manager and Board of Supervisors on Township fiscal matters.

EARNED INCOME TAX

Whitemarsh Township levies an earned income tax on its citizens and all nonresidents who work in the Township. Township residents pay a total rate of 1.25% on earned income. Fifty percent (50%) goes to the School District, 25% goes to the Township Open Space Fund. Nonresidents pay a total of 1%. The collection of the earned income tax is handled by an outside firm, Berkeimer Associates. Building Code Board of Appeals
The Appeals Board hears appeals concerning a decision or interpretation made under the provisions of the Whitemarsh Township Building, Plumbing, Mechanical and Electrical codes. It determines the suitability of alternate materials and types of construction, and interprets provisions of the Whitemarsh Township Building Codes. It reviews the Building Codes in force to review the present and proposed policies and procedure of enforcement of such codes, and reviews proposed revisions to the Codes. The Appeals Board submits advice and recommendations to the Board of Supervisors and the Township Manager concerning the enforcement, provisions and administration of the Whitemarsh Township Building Codes.

Emergency Services Board (meets 3rd Wednesday of each month, 7:30 p.m.)
The Emergency Services Board assists in the provision of primarily volunteer emergency services in the Township, proposes amendments to the Fire Prevention Code, regulations and the Code of its regulations, and advises the Board of Supervisors from time to time on all matters involving the provision of volunteer emergency services in the Township.

The Whitemarsh Authority (meets 4th Wednesday of each month, 7 p.m.)
The Whitemarsh Authority has a five-member Board appointed to staggered terms by the Board of Supervisors. The Authority is the legal owner of the Township's sanitary sewer collection and wastewater treatment facilities. The Authority has agreed to assume responsibility for the development of projects designed to improve storm water management and flood control throughout the Township. The Township's need to improve oversight of storm water problems was highlighted through the work of an ad hoc Stormwater Management Task Force, and as part of an effort to reduce inflow and infiltration of freshwater that adversely impacts sanitary sewer system operating costs during periods of heavy rain.

Historical Architectural Review Board (meets 2nd Wednesday, alternating months, 8 a.m.)
The Historical Architectural Review Board is appointed to provide advice to the Township Planning Commission, Park and Recreation Board and Board of Supervisors on matters dealing with the protection, conservation, management, promotion and use of natural resources located within the Township. The Board consists of seven residents appointed by the Board of Supervisors, serving overlapping three-year terms.

Open Space Committee (meets 4th Wednesday of each month, 7 p.m.)
The Open Space Committee is charged with identifying and recommending to the Board of Supervisors priority properties for preservation. Composed of seven members, the committee works with individual landowners and other entities, such as the Whitemarsh Foundation, the Wissahickon Valley Watershed Association, and the Montgomery County Lands Trust to accomplish its preservation goals. It has been actively involved in the initiative to save the 450-acre Erdensheim Farm, located in the heart of the Township, given its proximity to the City of Philadelphia. Whitemarsh is unusual in the amount of land within its borders that remains undeveloped. This abundance presents both great challenges—in terms of the cost of preservation—and great opportunities—in terms of creating an important legacy for the future. Using a broad set of strategies, from "growing greener" zoning to easements, tax incentives, and outright purchase, the Open Space Committee hopes to preserve 75% of the township's remaining undeveloped land, thereby sustaining the township's quality of life and protecting those environmental resources that help to protect us.

Shade Tree Commission (meets 1st Tuesday each month, 7 p.m.)
The Shade Tree Commission of Whitemarsh Township consists of five members appointed by the Board of Supervisors to serve overlapping five-year terms with administrative responsibility of Chapter 55, Tree Protection Standards, of the Code of the Township of Whitemarsh. The Shade Tree Commission is established to:

- Regulate the planting, removal and maintenance of vegetation within the ultimate rights of way of streets and highways within the Township.
- Ensure the selection of proper and suitable plant materials.
- Assist in the safe, orderly and efficient movement of pedestrians and vehicular traffic through public rights of way.
- Review and provide recommendations on landscaping for subdivision and development projects.
- Residents are encouraged to take a good look at their properties in the spring and trim any overgrowth that may present a safety hazard.

Zoning Hearing Board (meets 1st Wednesday of each month 7:30 p.m., plus first Monday following, 7:30 p.m.)
The Zoning Hearing Board consists of five residents appointed by the Board of Supervisors to serve five-year overlapping terms to render adjudications in the following matters:

- Substantive challenges to the validity of any land use ordinance.
- Appeals from the determination of the Zoning Officer, including, but not limited to, the granting or denial of any permit or failure to act on the application therefor, the issuance of any cease and desist order or the registration or refusal to register any nonconforming use, structure or lot.
- Appeals from a determination by a Township engineer or the Zoning Officer with reference to the administration of any flood plain or flood hazard ordinance or such provisions within a land use ordinance.
- Applications for variances from the terms of the zoning ordinance and flood hazard ordinance or such provisions within a land use ordinance.

Planning Commission (meets 2nd and 4th Tuesday each month 7:30 p.m.)
The Planning Commission is appointed to provide advice to the Board of Supervisors and the Zoning Hearing Board with respect to comprehensive land use planning and existing land use in Whitemarsh Township. The Planning Commission consists of seven Board members, four of whom are appointed by the Board of Supervisors, with the remaining three approved by the Library Board. Members of the Board of Directors are appointed for three-year overlapping terms.

Parks & Recreation Board (meets 1st Tuesday each month 7 p.m.)
The Parks and Recreation Board consists of five members. Four of the members are appointed by the Board of Supervisors and one member is a Director of the Colonial School District Board, recommended by the School Board and appointed annually by the Board of Supervisors. The members of the Parks and Recreation Board appointed by the Board of Supervisors serve four-year overlapping terms. The Parks & Recreation Board makes recommendations and provides advice to the Township Manager and the Board of Supervisors regarding the development of parks and recreational facilities operated by the Township.

SNOW REMOVAL REGULATIONS

Each year, with the first snowfall, the Township is flooded with telephone calls regarding the rules and policies affecting snow removal. Please note the following:

- As soon as snow or freezing rain begins, the Public Works Department starts salting and applying cinders on Township roads. Snow plowing begins when the snow depth reaches 3 to 4 inches. Many of our main roadways, such as Germantown Pike, Joshua Road, Ridge Pike, North Lane, Cedar Grove Road, Skippack Pike, Bethlehem Pike, Pennsylvania Avenue, Stenton Avenue, Flourtown Road, Miltria Hill Road and Butler Pike are not maintained by the Township. Snow and ice removal on these roads are the responsibility of PennDOT or Montgomery County.
- To assist with snow and ice removal, the Township Code requires all vehicles to be parked off-street when snow reaches a depth of 3 to 4 inches requiring plowing. Residents and businesses without sufficient off-street parking are required to adhere to the following schedule:
 - In even numbered areas (2004, 2006, etc.), parking is permitted on the side of the street with even numbered addresses.
 - In odd numbered calendar years (2003, 2005, etc.), parking is permitted on the side of the street with odd numbered addresses.
 - On streets with permanent parking restrictions (No Parking Here To Corner, No Parking, etc.), the permanent restrictions shall prevail.

PUBLIC WORKS

The Department of Public Works maintains Township streets, bridges, and storm sewers, and handles street cleaning, residential bulk, grass, brush, brush and leaf collection, snow removal and ice control.

It oversees the operational efficiency of all Township automotive and construction equipment, and the maintenance of the sanitary sewer pipes and pump stations, as well as the operation of a two-million gallon per day sewage treatment plant. Public Works also maintains all Township-owned buildings, parks and open space.

Residential Single-Stream Recycle Bank Collection

Please NOTE: Trash and Recyclables must NOT be put out before 7 p.m. the day before pick-up.

Residential Recyclable materials are collected once a week from occupied dwellings in Whitemarsh Township by J. P. Mascaro & Sons (Mascaro). Call the Township for the RecycleBank Collection Schedule of your property. For questions relating to collection procedures and/or complaints, you may call Mascaro at 800-432-1616 during regular business hours (Monday through Friday, 7 a.m. to 5 p.m.). The Township is participating in the innovative resident rewards based single-stream recycle program managed by RecycleBank. For questions relating to the rewards based program and/or complaints, you may call RecycleBank at 888-727-2978 or visit RecycleBank.com.

Single-Stream Recycling You may mix all recyclable materials into one Township-provided 64-gallon wheeled cart. There's no need to separate materials or even tie-or-bag newspapers.

Resident Rewards Based Program You can earn rewards based upon the weight of the materials you recycle. The wheeled cart is embedded with an identification chip that is recorded while the collection truck weighs the cart. RecycleBank measures your recyclables and awards you points that may be redeemed for rewards at hundreds of national and local businesses or may be credited to non-profit organizations. You may call RecycleBank at 888-727-2978 or visit their website to learn more about the rewards program or to activate your personal rewards account.

Recyclable Materials All paper products (newspapers, magazines, office papers, envelopes, junk mail, telephone books) and cardboard products (corrugated, cereal boxes, etc.), glass bottles, glass jars,

aluminum cans, steel cans, aerosol cans, plastic detergent containers, plastic containers #1 and #2 (numbers marked inside a triangle located on container bottom) and plastic milk containers. ALL GLASS, METAL AND PLASTIC MUST BE EMPTY. You may call RecycleBank at 888-727-2978 or visit their website to view the latest list of recyclable materials.

Collection Time begins at 7 a.m. It is not possible to set firm collection times for each neighborhood because of unforeseen circumstances along the route. To ensure that your trash materials will be collected, it is recommended that you place them curbside the night before, but no earlier than 7:00 p.m.

NO RETURN TRUCK PICK-UP TRIPS WILL BE MADE. All residential TRUCK MATERIALS MUST BE ENCLOSED in the 64-gallon wheeled cart.

Exclusions Items excluded from residential RecycleBank collection include: furniture, bulk and grass-brush-branch, household hazardous waste, construction and demolition waste and unacceptable waste defined by law. See below for details, and direct specific questions to us at 610-825-3535.

Holidays There is NO COLLECTION on New Year's Day, Memorial Day, Fourth of July, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day, or Christmas Day.

When your collection day falls on a holiday, your Recycling will be picked up on the next scheduled Recycling collection day in your district.

Residential Waste Collection

Residential waste is collected twice a week from most occupied dwellings in Whitemarsh Township by J. P. Mascaro & Sons. Call the Township for the Waste Collection Schedule of your property. In some neighborhoods the Homeowners Association contracts for trash collection.

System Authority of Eastern Montgomery County for disposal. To provide efficient and economical service, it is important that everyone complies with these rules. Whitemarsh Township and Mascaro each desire to provide the best possible service to the residents of White-marsh Township. Exclusions NO BULK ITEMS will be collected with residential Waste collection. Items excluded in residential waste collection include recyclable materials, bulk and grass-brush-branch (defined below), household hazardous waste, construction and demolition waste and unacceptable waste defined by law.

Holidays There is NO COLLECTION on New Year's Day, Memorial Day, Fourth of July, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day, or Christmas Day.

When your collection day falls on a holiday, your waste will be picked up on the next scheduled collection day in your district.

Residential BULK Collection

Bulk is collected on-demand Thursday Whitemarsh Township Public Works Department personnel collect Bulk from residential properties. To schedule on-demand Bulk collection call the Township at 610-825-3535 (Monday through Friday, 9 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.), on-demand Thursday. Bulk collections must be scheduled by 4 p.m. on Tuesday.

There is no charge to residents for household Bulk collections determined to be reasonable by the Township.

Items permitted in residential Bulk collection include household furniture, household major appliances, vehicle tires and batteries. **Exclusions** Items excluded in residential Bulk collection include waste (defined above), recyclable materials, grass-brush-branch (defined below), household hazardous waste, construction and demolition waste and unacceptable waste defined by law.

Call the Township at 610-825-3535 to verify acceptability.

Residential GRASS-BRUSH-BRANCH Collection

Grass-Brush-Branch materials must be separated from regular household trash. Whitemarsh Township Public Works Department personnel collect Grass-Brush-Branch from residential properties. To determine the schedule for Grass-Brush-Branch collection call the Township at 610-825-3535 (Monday through Friday, 9 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.).

There is no charge to residents for household Bulk collections determined to be reasonable by the Township. Items permitted

- To assist with snow and ice removal, the Township Code requires all vehicles to be parked off-street when snow reaches a depth of 3 to 4 inches requiring plowing. Residents and businesses without sufficient off-street parking are required to adhere to the following schedule:
 - In even numbered areas (2004, 2006, etc.), parking is permitted on the side of the street with even numbered addresses.
 - In odd numbered calendar years (2003, 2005, etc.), parking is permitted on the side of the street with odd numbered addresses.
 - On streets with permanent parking restrictions (No Parking Here To Corner, No Parking, etc.), the permanent restrictions shall prevail.

Hints for Clearing Snow

WAIT UNTIL THE SNOW PLOWS HAVE MADE A FIRST PASS BEFORE CLEARING YOUR DRIVEWAY. Be sure snow piles are located to the right of your driveway. This way, less snow will be re-directed into the driveway with each passing truck.

KNOW THE TOWNSHIP'S SNOW EMERGENCY PARKING REGULATIONS. Stay tuned to KWV (1060 AM) for all snow emergency announcements.

KEEP YOUR SIDEWALKS AND CURBS. Neighborhood children need safe access to schools and bus stops throughout the winter months. Clearing your sidewalk helps children travel to school safely.

BE PATIENT. State, County and Township Crews will work around the clock, if needed, to ensure all roadways are cleared as quickly as possible.

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
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
